



Sustainability

WORKING TOWARDS A GREENER FUTURE

Sustainability is central to how we operate at Rotherham College and the RNN Group, something that all staff and students contribute to.

We have to change the way we heat and power our buildings, and the way we run our business, to reduce our greenhouse gas emissions and to make our campuses a home for nature. As educators we have an added duty to teach our students about sustainability, in a place in which sustainability is commonplace.

THE SUSTAINABLE THINGS WE DO

As a Group, here is a list of the many actions we are taking to reduce our footprint:

ENERGY AND UTILITIES

The Group has a number of solar panels / solar heaters and wind turbines as well as a ground source heat pump at one college to produce clean energy, as well as capturing rainwater for use and moving to LED lights.

TRAVEL AND TRAVEL REDUCTION

We operate a number of Electric charging points and have a salary sacrifice scheme for bike users, bike boxes for secure cycle storage and shower facilities for bike users too.

Not only that, more meetings are conducted digitally to remove travelling between sites and there are hybrid working opportunities for most staff. Our Transport provider Zeelo - the first global bus platform to offer 100% carbon neutral services - is committed to all-electric vehicles by 2030. Since September 2022 Zeelo have supported:

Saved 10.01 tonnes of CO2 (3.2Kg per rider) on RNN Group Bus Routes / Taken 2,853 car journeys off the road on RNN Group Bus Routes.

RECYCLING AND UPCYCLING

Our students run clothing rails across the Group for pre-loved clothing to be picked up by another learner and we use recycled wood, metal and plaster across our construction departments as well as recycling cardboard and paper.

ENVIRONMENT AND SUSTAINABILITY COMMITTEE

Our learners regularly talk about ways we can make things better.

GOOGLE REFERENCE COLLEGE

Through the use of Google Workspace for education, we have significantly reduced our printing which supports our journey to becoming more sustainable by reducing paper usage and energy.

GO LOCAL

We make a point of using local contractors and partners as our suppliers.

FLORA AND FAUNA

We support the 'No Mow May' and we have wildlife gardens, woodland management in operation, are part of the Big Schools Bird Watch and Dearne Valley College is a Hedgehog friendly campus.

PRINT AND PAPER

We now use non PVC banners and all our printed literature is FSC graded or recycled. We're also moving away from printing lots of guides in favor of using QR codes linked to our digital prospectus.



Wellbeing Support

WELLBEING IS AT THE HEART OF OUR COLLEGES AND VALUES

Rotherham College recognises and places a great importance on mental health awareness and wellbeing for all members of our community – both students and staff.

We have a dedicated Student Support Team at Rotherham College, who offer help and support to students who may be experiencing difficult/challenging times in their personal worlds.

PEOPLE SEEK OUR TEAM'S SUPPORT FOR MANY REASONS SUCH AS EXPERIENCING:

- Anxiety, stress and panic attacks
- Feeling overwhelmed in public settings
- Low mood
- Loss and bereavement
- Disturbing and unwanted thoughts and images

- Poor sleep
- Relationship difficulties
- · Identity and Self-image issues
- Abuse/bullying
- Addictive behaviours (including substance abuse)
- Past trauma
- Troublesome repetitive behaviours
- Self-harming
- Frequent or troublesome issues with anger
- Concerns about living with physical illness/conditions
- Housing difficulties/problems at home
- Financial worries
- Our Student Support Team offers Mentoring, Counselling, and Safeguarding.

MENTORING

Mentoring tends to be the first point of contact normally when accessing our team.

Mentoring offers:

- A safe space to offload, puzzle over, and work positively toward managing life issues and emotionally upsetting times
- Links to Health Support, Social Support and Primary/Secondary Care
- Practical support with housing and financial applications, and travelling to college issues
- Appropriate advocacy when a learner may need support linking with other teams/organisations within college and sometimes with external agencies
- A place to discuss the possibility of a referral to counselling, if counselling has been requested or advised
- Safety and Welfare: Mentors and Welfare Officers will always work to keep students and the community safe and are all fully trained safeguarding staff
- Wellbeing advice including sexual health, self-care themes and self-help information

COUNSELLING

Counselling offers:

Professional Counselling - all counsellors have professional membership and follow an ethical code of practice

A safe, private and confidential space to explore often deeper, complex or more troublesome issues in a more methodical and structured way

Various choices for the student/client to make in how their counselling process progresses and which methods/models work best for each individual (Tailored approach)

The chance of developing a useful, positive and supportive relationship whilst working through concerns

Introducing Online Mental Health Support: Togetherall is a free online mental health support service.

Whether you're suffering from stress, are struggling to sleep or simply need someone to talk to, Togetherall can help you get support, take control and feel better.

You can get things off your chest in their anonymous global community, express yourself creatively and access a library of self-care resources – including clinical tests, tips and guided group courses with topics ranging from Managing Stress and Anxiety to Quitting Smoking. Trained professionals are online 24/7 to keep all members safe and provide extra support

IS MY IDENTITY PRIVATE?

On Togetherall you are totally anonymous to other members in the community and your personal information is kept secure while you are on the site.

Nobody will be informed if you've signed up to Togetherall or of your activity on the service unless they are seriously concerned about your safety whilst on campus.

HOW DO I CREATE A PROFILE?

Registering with Togetherall is quick and easy. Simply go to www.togetherall.com. Click the 'Join Us' button, select the option 'I'm from a University or College' and input your student email address.

You create an anonymised username and will be requested to provide information such as your age, gender, ethnicity, employment status and how you heard about Togetherall – you can prefer not to answer.

HOW DO I USE THE WEBSITE?

You can access Togetherall on any device with an internet connection. The home page has three options for you to explore:

COMMUNITY

Here you can see posts by other members of the online community and filter by categories (e.g. anxiety). You can also create your own posts for others to join in friendly and helpful discussion.

RESOURCES

This page has plenty of useful self-help features including interactive tools such as journals and self-assessments structure by standard NHS measures. You can also find clinically-established articles which highlight appropriate knowledge for anything you'd like to work on; these can be filtered by category.

COURSES

There are a variety of self-help courses which can be interactive with other Togetherall users. These courses share best practice on how to tackle that issue you're looking for help with. You'll be asked to take a self-assessment both at the beginning and end of the course. Courses are structured so that each section must be completed to unlock the next one.







Your Study Options

Whether you're leaving school or returning to education, college is an exciting time filled with new experiences and gives you the freedom to choose your next step.

At Rotherham College we have a number of options for your post-16 choice including technical courses, T Levels and apprenticeships. You will acquire handson experience in a subject that interests you, allowing you to develop the industry skills and knowledge needed to begin a successful career.

Throughout this course guide your options will be explained to help you make an informed decision. If a number of options spark an interest, you can apply for more than one and you don't have to decide until you get your GCSE results in August which route you wish to take.

TECHNICAL COURSES

Technical courses are specialist courses focusing on one subject area. These courses come in a range of different course areas and provide you with all the practical skills and knowledge needed in your future career. On a technical course, you usually spend around three days-aweek studying your chosen course, with the rest of the time free to complete assignments, undertake work experience or pursue a hobby.

You may know technical courses as BTECs, NVQ and VRQs, with different courses available at a level to suit each student.

T LEVELS

T Levels are similar to technical courses, as they provide specialist training in a given area. The difference between the two is that T Levels include an in-depth industry placement that lasts at least 45 days.

APPRENTICESHIPS

An apprenticeship is a paid job where you will receive practical training and work alongside experienced staff. You will be in a real working environment, gaining employability skills and knowledge of an industry-sector.

As an apprentice, you'll work towards a nationally recognised qualification and typically spend four days a week in the workplace and one day a week at College.

Apprenticeships are competitive like any job so it's worth having a college course as a back-up option.

Our courses are offered in a variety of different levels, we refer to them as Introduction Skills (Entry Level 1 - Entry Level 3), Level 1, Level 2 and Level 3 courses.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

If you haven't achieved GCSE maths and English at grades 4 or above you will undertake these qualifications alongside your main programme. In addition to qualifications, you should also have genuine interest in the area you wish to study.

The table on page 26 shows our typical entry requirements. Some courses have additional entry requirements, which are listed throughout this guide. You can also find more information on our college websites.

PROGRESSION

After completing a Level 3 qualification you could progress into employment, further training or Higher Education.

We have Higher Education courses ranging from Level 4 to Level 7 available at our college campuses and our dedicated Higher Education campus, University Centre Rotherham (UCR). This includes Foundation Degrees, HNCs, HNDs, BA/BSc Honours and more.

Technical Course?

Technical courses are designed to help you to develop the skills and confidence to succeed in your chosen career. You will be taught by tutors with industry skills and experience and you'll learn in high-quality, purpose-built facilities that simulate a real working environment.

Technical courses at Level 3 are equivalent to A-Levels and are worth UCAS points, which means you can progress onto university after completion. They are mostly assessed by project work across the year and can involve some exams and tests depending on the qualification.



Vocational courses have many different names such as BTECs, NVQs (National Vocational Qualifications) and VRQs (Vocationally Related Qualifications) that are available at different educational levels.

Technical courses at Entry, Level 1 and Level 2 also help students develop their skills and move towards work or higherlevel courses

At College, students have lots of contact with employers and businesses through work experience, talks, visits or real-life projects. Graphic design and Photography students have recently created a series of designs for Wentworth Woodhouse to engage a younger audience to visit as well as having their work showcased at the We Wonder Noir festival.

Our students go on trips to bring their subjects to life. For example, Business, Retail and Tourism students went to Clifton Park Museum to complete their tour guiding and storytelling project as they guided staff around the museum and explained the history and origins of the site.

Students may also be involved in activities that develop skills of enterprise and entrepreneurship demonstrated by our games animation students, who hosted a games play fundraiser afternoon to raise money for Rotherham Hospital's Children's Ward.

As well as brilliant skill-developing activities, students also take part in fantastic competitions such as the yearly inter-college championship where Rotherham College and Dearne Valley College compete against Grimsby Institute in over 30 subject areas.

T-LEVELS

THE NEXT LEVEL QUALIFICATION

WHAT ARE T LEVELS?

We will be delivering T Levels from September 2023 which offer students a mixture of classroom learning and an industry placement of 315 hours (45 days) where you will be fully integrated into the workplace. T Levels are two-year technical programmes, designed with employers, to give young people the practical skills and knowledge that industries need. The 'T' stands for technical and they are an alternative to A-Levels. One T Level is equivalent to 3 A-Levels and will be assessed using a mixture of practical tasks, projects and exams.

Higher Technical Qualifications

HIGHER TECHNICAL QUALIFICATIONS (HTQS) ARE SPECIALIST TECHNICAL COURSES DEVELOPED WITH EMPLOYERS AND DELIVERED BY INDUSTRY EXPERTS.

WHAT ARE HTQS?

HTQs have been developed in partnership with employers and are delivered by industry experts and focus on the skills, knowledge and behaviours that are in-demand by employers.

They can also act as a stepping stone to further study, such as an apprenticeship or undergraduate degree. Whether you're looking to take the next step in your chosen career or want to retrain into a new industry, an HTQ can help you gain the skills you need for a specialist technical job.

The first HTQs, focussing on digital sector subjects like Cyber Security or Software Development, began teaching in September 2022.

New qualifications in Health and Science and Construction, began teaching in September 2023, with more sectors coming soon.

WHAT WILL I ACHIEVE?

By completing an HTQ you will also achieve a Level 4 or 5 qualification in your subject area. These technical qualifications include Foundation Degrees, Higher National Certificates and Higher National Diplomas.

The courses are classroom-based with the opportunity to learn practical skills through workshops, role playing exercises, or using industry facilities.

From September 2023, University Centre Rotherham, Rotherham College and Dearne Valley College are offering HTQs in digital, construction and health and science.

COURSE DURATION

On average an HTQ will take between 1 and 2 years to complete if studying full-time. Flexible options such as part-time, online and learning through short courses may also be available.

HTQs are provided by universities, Institutes of Technology, local colleges and independent providers.

CARPENTRY AND JOINERY

TRAVELLING TO US...

BY BUS

Our colleges are close to many bus routes across South Yorkshire.

Rotherham Interchange bus station, which is conveniently located close to our town centre campus, also provides great travel access to and from surrounding areas.

The Traveline journey planner can help you plan a route and get information about public transport services: **traveline.info**

We also run a college bus service, which you can view on the next page.

BY TRAIN

Rotherham College is located a short walk from Rotherham Central train station (RMC). Rotherham Central also operates a tram-train service between Sheffield City Centre and Rotherham.

The closest train station to Dearne Valley College are Bolton- upon-Dearne (BTD), Mexborough (MEX) and Swinton (SWN).

If you travel a lot by train you could benefit from a railcard.

A 16-17 saver railcard gets you 50% off standard anytime, off peak, advance and season tickets. It is just £30 and is valid for one year or until your 18th birthday, whichever comes first. For more information visit **16-17saver.co.uk**

A 16-25 railcard can get you 1/3 off rail travel for everyone aged 16-25 for just £30 for one year or £70 for three years. For more information visit 16-25 railcard.co.uk

Mature students can also apply for a oneyear railcard, which can be extended with evidence of continuing to study every year.

BY CAR

A number of public car parks are located within easy walking distance of Rotherham College and the Construction Centre including Drummond Street and Percy Street.

Dearne Valley College offers free car parking for students and visitors.

TRAVEL PASSES

There are free travel passes available to students, offering cheaper fares on public transport networks in South Yorkshire.

The 16-18 travel pass allows young people to travel on buses and trams for as little as 80p per journey and half-fare travel on Northern trains. Passes are valid all year round for up to two years.

There are also 18-21 passes available to those who live in South Yorkshire which also offer 80p travel in South Yorkshire to those aged 18 to 21.

There are tickets available for fares in South Yorkshire that range from 1,7, 28 day or annual period to make travelling to college cheaper.

If you are aged over 18, an 18-22 card is available regardless of where you live, for travel in South Yorkshire. The card offers 15% off the price of 1, 7 or 28 day TravelMaster tickets.
