Working in residential or nursing homes, domiciliary care, day centres or some clinical healthcare settings; Lead Adult Care Workers are frontline staff who work with adults with care and support needs to achieve their personal goals and live as independently and safely as possible, enabling them to have control and choice in their lives.

You will have responsibility for providing supervision, frontline leadership, guidance and direction for others, or will work autonomously, exercising judgement and accountability.

You will be instrumental in improving the health and wellbeing of those receiving care and support.
