You will study anatomy, physiology, and health assessments, becoming an expert at identifying skin conditions and structural issues. The curriculum also places a heavy emphasis on professional ethics and business management, covering everything from health and safety regulations to customer relations and salon planning. Whether you dream of opening your own business or working in a high-end salon, this diploma provides the necessary skills and knowledge to work in a demanding and highly satisfying career.
